A - Golgi body

G - nucleus

B - Cell Wall

H - mitochondria

C - cytoplasm

I - chloroplasts

D - ribosomes

J - cell membrane

E - endoplasmic reticulum

K - vacuole

F - lysosomes

Here is a copy of what you see on the form. Each letter can only be used once. The way to do this type or mix and match is to do the question you know first (not necessarily the order in which they
