Trip Rules

- Life jackets must be secured before (not after) entering a canoe. Safety whistle will be secured and available.
- Fires will not be lit at any time, unless required for emergency heat. All cooking will be done on camp stoves.
- Low impact camping and hiking techniques will be practised. All waste water will be disposed of at least 20 m away from shore in a depressed area of soil. Care will be taken not to disturb the delicate plant life present in this area. All human waste will be disposed of in temporary latrines.
- If any person leaves the main camping area, they will do so in groups no smaller than three. A teacher/chaperone will be asked for permission and given specifics of the direction of travel. The distance from the main camping area will not be far (not out of voice range). Any excursions that are further from camp will require a teacher chaperon. If a teacher/chaperone feels that the conditions are not favourable, participants will be expected to remain with the main group. All participants must be in the campsite no later than 20 minutes after sunset.
- Participants are expected to behave in a respectful manner to each other, teacher/chaperones and the natural environment at all times. The school code of conduct will be followed at all times.
